Oral Compounding Standardization and Enhanced Patient Safety through Workflow Technology

- Identify the need for high-quality sterile compounding training for pharmacy technicians.
- Describe available sterile compounding training opportunities for pharmacy technicians.
- Discuss techniques for providing advanced sterile compounding training and education using a hospital-based pharmacy technician training program as an example.
- Discuss the inspection process by the State Drug Control Division.
- Summarize common areas of deficiencies and violations cited from 5/2017 to 5/2018.
- Recognize non-conforming data.
- Discuss the improvement seen in third party certification company testing reports reviewed by Drug Control.
- Discuss administrative action by the Department for sterile compounding violations.
- Describe oral recipe standardization across a five hospital health system.
- Identify safety elements in specific patient populations.
- Outline the oral compounding process through workflow technology.
- Illustrate the benefits of workflow technology on enhanced safety and decreased waste.
