Here are just a few of the things that we've done and the people who have led them.


- Lead by Molly Leber and other past presidents; we have completed a total overhaul of our bylaws, making them up-to-date and more reflective of our commitment to our members

Thank you for all that you do and your ongoing support!

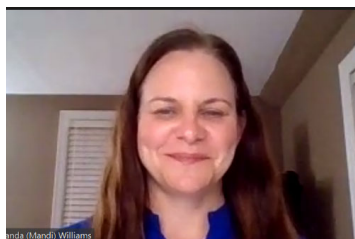

The 2020–2021 CSHP Resident Task Force has hit the ground running, overcoming multiple obstacles that this year has brought current and new residents by creating multiple new opportunities. allow participants to earn graduate credits towards a master's degree. Apply by Feb. 16 for an early bird discount. [MORE >>>](#)

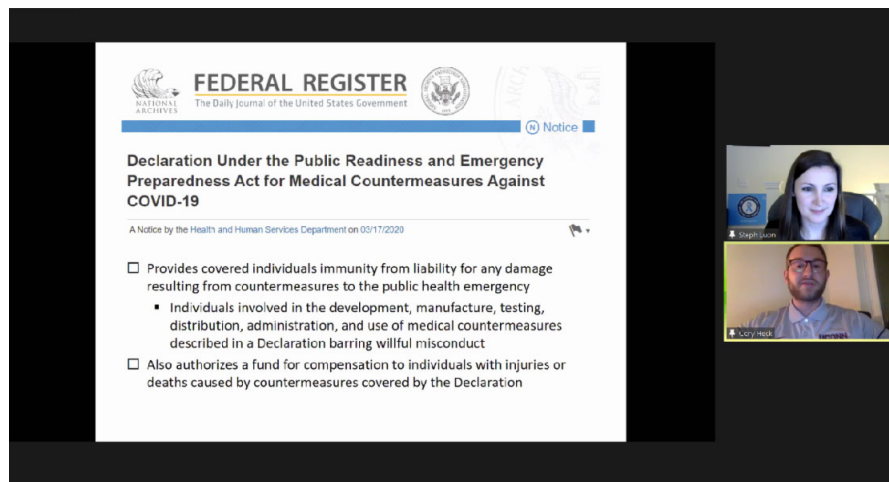
ASHP Foundation Optimizing Technology Solutions Innovation Grant
